## 2007 WELCOME TO SPRING!

### OUR BRANCH REMOVAL PROGRAM HAS CHANGED FOR THE 2007 SEASON!

We have found it necessary to make changes to our program beginning this season. Branches will be removed one week per month starting in April.

The Public Works chipper will begin north of the Prairie Path and continue south until the entire Village is completed. (There will be no sections on designated days.) We will start on Monday and continue branch removal until the Public Works crew has completed each street.

### WE WILL NOT RETURN ONCE A STREET HAS BEEN COMPLETED

The Public Works Department documents each street with the time and date it was completed. If you should have any questions concerning the time or date your street was completed please call the Public Works office at 708-202-3434, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

### GUIDELINES

Place branches on parkway **NO EARLIER** than **Sunday** before pickup week begins.

Entire trees **will not** be removed. (If you cut down a tree please make arrangements with a hauling service to remove debris.)

Branch piles not to exceed 8' long by 5' high by 5' wide. (Only a reasonable amount will be removed). Please be advised that trimmings cannot be left on the parkway after the chipper has passed.

Roots must be removed from bushes (they cannot be chipped). Roots will be picked up separately.

Logs 5" or more in diameter must be cut into lengths of 2' or less and stacked on the parkway for pickup by another truck.

**Do not mix yard waste with branches.** Yard waste (leaves, plan debris, grass clippings, corn stalks, etc.) must be placed in a 30 gallon container or yard waste bag with a yard waste sticker affixed to it for removal the same day your garbage & recyclables are collected.
