### CLEAN UP WEEK...May 19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>

The warm weather is here to stay (hopefully) and it's the perfect time to do some "**SPRING CLEANING**" and clean OUT that dreaded crawl space, basement, garage and attic. Residents are encouraged to remove any unwanted trash, furniture, appliances, etc. that have accumulated over the years. Please place these items out on your **REGULAR TRASH COLLECTION DAY OF CLEAN UP WEEK.** **This opportunity comes only once a year, so we hope you take advantage of it.**

**Acceptable items** ...**Appliances:** (stoves, refrigerators, etc), **Bulk Items:** (bicycles, toys, etc), **Carpets:** must be in rolls no more than 5 feet in length and 2 feet in diameter, **Fixtures:** (toilets, sinks, etc.), **Furniture, Paint:** (must be hardened in cans with lids **OFF**), **Landscaping timbers:** must be no longer than 3 feet in length.

**Non Acceptable items** ...Car Batteries, Explosives, Tires, any type of Fluid (gas, oil, etc.), Ammunition, Radioactive Material, Riding Lawnmowers/Snow blowers, Hazardous or Medical Waste, Large Automobile Parts, Boats, Snowmobiles, Bricks, Concrete Blocks, Cement or Asphalt Pavement Material, Construction and Demolition debris.

**Disposal of Televisions...**The Village of Hillside and Waste Management **will NOT** pick-up TV's even during clean-up week! TV's have many toxic materials and should not be disposed of in landfills. It is the responsibility of the owner to dispose of electronics properly. The Village of Hillside and the Hillside Library temporarily have a recycling bin for electronics only, where you can dispose of your TV's and electronics properly. However, if your TV is *larger than 30 inches you must use an alternate recycling facility.* **Goodwill** is located in the mall at the corner of Wolf Road and 31st Street in Westchester and they are considered a recycling facility that accepts all electronics working and non-working. If you have any questions regarding the recycling of your electronics that you want to bring to **Goodwill**, please call them at (708) 562-6166.

### MEMORIAL DAY, MONDAY, MAY 26th, 12:00 HILLSIDE COMMONS

**Why Memorial Day?** Look to the cemeteries from *Arlington National*, to state, and our own local gravesites, that on **Memorial Day** are decorated with flags that tell the world, "**Here Lies a Veteran**"! The day was first observed on May 30, 1868, when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. ## IMPORTANT NEWS FROM YOUR POLICE DEPARTMENT CURFEW IN HILLSIDE!

Warmer weather brings a rise in the incidences of curfew violations, Enforcing curfew begins with proactive efforts by parents. You know what trouble await your children if they are out past curfew. Here are some tips...know what your kids are doing and where they are...know their friends and pay attention to any changes in their behavior...establish and maintain a relationship with your kids which allows them to feel comfortable talking to you and asking questions before they make the wrong choices...set the rules and **HOLD THE LINE.**

Village Ordinance allows for citing minors under the age of 17 to be upon a public road, public place, business or amusement areas after 10:30PM Sunday through Thursday, and 11:30PM Friday and Saturday. Ordinance also allows for the citing of parents whose children are found to be out past curfew.

### "JAYWALKING" IS A VIOLATION

We would like to remind everyone that walking down the middle of the street is strictly prohibited. Pedestrians must cross at the corner and with the flow of traffic. "Jaywalking" will not be tolerated. Violations of pedestrian traffic rules will be issued. Citations begin at \$50.00 per violation and increase for multiple offenses. Please discuss this with family members and tell everyone of the potential dangers. This violation will be enforced and tickets will be issued.

### BUCKLE-UP IT'S THE LAW and DROP THE CELL PHONE AND DRIVE

In Illinois, the driver and all passengers in a vehicle need to be belted in all seating positions, no matter where you sit. Officers can and will pull over vehicles and give citations if this law is not followed. Also, no talking on a cell phone while you are driving unless it is a hands-free device. If you have to make a call or text, please pull over. Drivers caught using a hand-held cellphone while driving could be fined. Repeat offenders could be fined and have their license suspended.

### PLEASE KEEP YOUR PETS ON A LEASH!

Village rules require all pets to be licensed (free at the Village Hall), have their Rabies shots up to date, be on a leash and cannot run at large. Also, cleaning up after your pets is a must. Please comply with the Village Ordinances.

### **NOTE TO OUR RESIDENTS...SAFETY FIRST!!!**

The warm weather is here and scammers are ready to spring into action. Be on guard to protect yourself against common seasonal scams such as home improvement and utilities. Always ask to see their identification and do not let anyone into your home without an appointment. **NEVER** give out personal information and **NEVER** pay on-site for services. Be skeptical of individuals wearing clothing with old or defaced company logos. Do not hesitate to call the Police Department and most of all, be aware of your surroundings at all times.

### **Volunteer and Become a Member of Hillside's Emergency Management Agency**

The Village of Hillside's EMA is a department that is composed of volunteers who provide emergency response to natural and man-made disasters. Training, equipment, uniforms and personal protective equipment will be provided to members as well as ongoing classes keeping our members current in response techniques. Meetings are the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of every month, 7:00-9:00pm at the Command Center, 4151 May Street in Hillside. Hillside residents must be 18 years of age or older and applications are available at the Village Hall. ### **THE VILLAGE OF HILLSIDE'S SENIOR CITIZEN 50/50 TAXICAB PROGRAM**

The Village, in its continuing efforts to help senior citizens live an independent lifestyle, offers our residents a **50/50 Taxicab Reimbursement Program**. This program allows seniors to travel anywhere in Chicago and the suburbs. The requirements are as follows: Hillside **Seniors 60 years and over and also disabled residents** may enroll in this program at the Village Hall. Proof of age and residency is required such as State I.D., birth certificate, passport, etc. Once you are enrolled, the Village will issue you a permanent taxicab I.D. Card in order to purchase your 50/50 taxicab coupons. Coupons are sold in \$10.00 booklets for which you only pay \$5.00 per booklet and the Village pays the remaining \$5.00. Coupons can pay for the entire fare, including tip, or you can use the coupons for the fare and tip the driver in cash, the choice is yours. The coupon allows you to bring up to three friends of any age on your trip at no additional cost. There is no expiration date ...however, **ONLY AMERICAN TAXI ACCEPTS THE 50/50 COUPONS.** This is a great program, but if you need more information, please call the Village Hall at (708) 449-6450 during regular business hours for assistance.



### **HAVE YOU TESTED YOUR HOME FOR RADON YET?**

Radon is the Nation's second leading cause of Lung Cancer after cigarette smoking. The U.S. E.P.A. and the U. S. Surgeon General recommend testing all homes below the third floor for Radon. For a FREE packet of Radon information and to purchase a kit call the Cook County Department of Environmental control (708) 865-6177. This information is available through the office of Toni Preckwinkle, President, Cook County Board of Commissioners, Radon Awareness Program.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC WORKS AND BUILDING SERVICES



### MAY SPRING CLEAN-UP WEEK

The week of **May 19th through May 23rd** will be our spring clean-up week. Please see **Mayor Tamburino's** column on the front page for all the details.



### STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping for the month of May will be the week of **May 12th through May 16th** and **May 27th through May 30th**. For the month of June, the dates are **June 9th through June 13th** and **June 23rd through June 27th**.

Please refrain from parking on the street from **6:00am to 4:30pm** during these dates.



### BRANCH PICK-UP

Branch pick-up for the month of **MAY** will be the week of **May 5th through May 9th**. Place branches out on the parkway on **Sunday May 4th** to be assured your branches will be picked up. Public Works documents each street with the date and time it was completed. **Branch pick-up for the month of JUNE** will be the week of **June 9th through June 13th**. Remember, place branches on the parkway on **Sunday, June 8th** to be assured of branch pick-up.

**PUBLIC WORKS WILL NOT RETURN ONCE A STREET HAS BEEN COMPLETED!**

### GUIDELINES FOR BRANCH PICK UP

- Make arrangements with a hauling service to remove debris when cutting down an entire tree as it will not be removed by Public Works
- Branch piles are not to exceed 8' long by 5' high by 5' wide.
- Logs 5' or more in diameter must be cut into lengths of 2' or less, stacked and will be picked up separately.
- Bush roots must be removed and will be picked up separately.
- Do not mix yard waste with branches.



### YARD WASTE

Yard waste will be picked up on your garbage pick-up day in the **GREEN** yard waste carts. If you have additional yard waste, you must use brown yard waste bags; no sticker required, or a 32gal. unlined garbage can that is marked "**Yard Waste Only**".

### REFUSE CARTS

When the Village began a contract with Waste Management for the disposal of refuse, each house was provided with **3 carts**, which are Village property. Each home should have **1 GRAY garbage cart**, **1 BLUE recycle material cart** and **1 GREEN yard waste cart**. All carts have a serial number to identify which house they belong to. If you have more than one cart in any color, please call the Village Public Works Department and report the serial numbers to us so we can identify the proper owner. Every house should have one of each cart so refuse can be disposed of properly.

### STREET LIGHTS

Do you see street lights out in the Village? If so, please report the outage to the Public Works/Building Services Department. We don't always know about a street light that is out, or one that is turning off and back on again...that's why we need the help of the community to get the lights back on and keep our Village lit up.
