**MOBILE DRIVER SERVICES FACILITY IS COMING TO
THE VILLAGE OF HILLSIDE, THURSDAY, OCTOBER 11TH!**

The Illinois Secretary of State’s Mobile Driver Services Facility will offer Driver’s License Renewals, duplicate or corrected Driver’s Licenses, Vision Screening for Licenses, Illinois Photo Identification Cards, License Plate Renewal Stickers and information on how to register to become an organ and tissue donor. Mark your calendar for **Thursday, October 11th from 10:00AM until 2:00PM** for these services to be held right here at the **Village Hall, 425 Hillside Avenue**. Driver’s License Renewals can be made up to one year in advance, and all residents of Illinois are eligible to use this facility. Normal issuance and renewal fees will apply, but Illinois residents at least 65 years of age may obtain a photo identification card (not license) at no charge. To apply for a duplicate or corrected driver’s license or ID card, two forms of identification must be presented. Sorry, but **NO** road tests will be given at this location.

SENIOR SNOW PLOWING



Enrollment forms will be available at the Village Hall starting
October 1st and must be returned by **October 31st**.
Each year a *new* enrollment form must be filled out.



The following requirements must be met to be eligible for the plowing:

- A person must be 65 years or older, retired and live in a single residence home.
- No able-bodied or employed persons under 65 can reside in the household.
- Minimum of 3" of snow must fall and all Village streets and alleys must be cleared before any senior plowing will be done.

BRANCH REMOVAL FOR SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER



Branch removal will be the week of **September 10th** through **September 14th** . **Make sure branches are on the parkway by Sunday, September 9th**, and leave them until they are removed. For October, branch removal will be the week of **October 8th** through **October 12th**. **Make sure branches are on the parkway by Sunday, October 7th.**

We will not return once a street has been completed.

NOTE: If you have small branches or twigs at another time of the month, you can cut them up and place them into your green yard waste cart for removal on your regular garbage day. In addition, Waste Management will pick-up branches that are secured with twine as long as the piles are no bigger than 2 feet long 2 feet wide by 2 feet high.

STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping is scheduled for the weeks of:

September 4th — September 7th and September 17th — September 21st.

Please refrain from parking on the streets from 6:00AM until 4:30PM during these dates.
