



Every 10-Year Census Information in Mail in Mid-March

(Este artículo del censo está en español en la página 6.)

Between March 12th and March 20th, invitations will be mailed to 95% of U.S. households regarding one's participation in the once every ten-year census count. The remaining 5% of households who have P.O. boxes or are in remote areas will be interviewed by a census form taker.

Unlike past census counts, most of the population will **NOT** be initially mailed a census form to fill out. Instead, for the first time ever, most households will be mailed a letter offering an option to fill out a census form on-line, which is what the Census Bureau is hoping most people do. The letter inviting them to respond online will have a unique household ID and the web address of the official Census Bureau website. This invite will also give instructions on how to respond by phone (12 language options available). Option 3 allows people to apply for a census form to be mailed to them. You can request a paper form in Spanish.



Census Form Timeline

1. The initial letter offering a person the ability to fill out the Census form on-line will be mailed out March 12th to March 20th.
2. A reminder letter will then be sent out a few days later.
3. **If you haven't responded by then:** A reminder postcard will be sent between March 26th and April 3rd.
4. **If you still haven't responded:** A reminder letter and paper

Recreational Cannabis Is Legal in Illinois... What You Should Know About the New Law

On January 1, 2020, Illinois became the 11th state to allow the sale of recreational cannabis. The new state law allows consumers 21 and older to possess and use recreational marijuana products **purchased only from licensed sellers (currently 55 in Illinois)**. The law allows a maximum of 500 dispensaries to open on a staggered basis through 2022.

Initially, medical marijuana dispensaries are the only legal sellers of cannabis for recreational use. But by mid-2020, the state is expected to grant additional licenses to dozens of new stores, processors, cultivators and transporters.

Download the *Ring Neighbors App* And Help Hillside Police Fight Crime




Hillside's Census Headcount Through the Years



This 1946 black and white picture shows Hillside segueing from farmland in anticipation of the suburban housing boom started by World War II veterans and their families. You can see streets being laid out for future housing developments.

The white building with the dark roof seen in upper left housed St. Domitilla's school, which at the time had around 200 students. By 1962, St. Domitilla would have over 1,800 students.

The recent Google Map satellite shot shows approximately the same area as seen in the 1946 black and white picture. Hillside experienced a little over a 500% percentage increase in population between the time these two pictures were taken.



questionnaire will be mailed out April 8th-April 16th.

- 5. **And if you still have not responded:** A final reminder postcard will be mailed April 20th-27th before the Census Bureau follows up in person.
- 6. **All households who are not compliant with filling out a Census Form will be visited by a Census Worker starting May 13th.**

*** *Census results are to be reported to the President by December 31st, 2020.*

Census Data is Confidential and NO Questions About Citizenship Status Will Be Asked

Your census questionnaire answers are kept confidential by the U.S. Census Bureau. Your information is protected and cannot be shared with any other federal or state government agency. Results are reported in terms of numbers, no names are ever revealed in any Census reports.

2020 Census Questions to Be Answered on Census Form

- How many people are living or staying at your home on April 1, 2020.
- Whether the home is owned or rented which helps produce statistics about homeownership and renting and help in administering housing programs and informing planning decisions.
- About the sex of each person in your home. This allows the Census Bureau to create statistics which can be used in planning and funding government programs and can also be used to enforce laws, regulations and policies against discrimination.
- About the age of each person in your home. The U.S. Census Bureau creates statistics to better understand the size and characteristics of different age groups. Agencies use this data to plan and fund government programs that support specific age groups, including children and older adults.
- About the race of each person in your home. This allows the Bureau to create statistics about race and to provide other

statistics by racial groups. This data helps federal agencies monitor compliance with anti-discrimination provisions, such as those in the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act.


- About whether a person in your home is of Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin. This is needed by federal agencies to monitor compliance with anti-discrimination provisions, such as those in the Voting Rights Act and the Civil Rights Act. **Again, it must be noted that there will be no question about citizenship status.**
- About the relationship of each person in your home. This allows the Census Bureau to create estimates about families, households and other groups. Relationship data is used in planning and funding government programs that support families, including people raising children alone.

What Will **NOT** Be Asked on the 2020 Census Form?

- The Census Bureau **will never ask** for:
- Your Immigration or Citizenship Status.
 - Your Social Security Number.
 - Anything on behalf of a political party.
 - Your bank account or credit card numbers.

It should be noted that returning an incomplete Census Form could result in either a follow-up phone call or a home visit.

The Hillside Public Library will have computers with Internet capability for those who do not have these resources available in your residence. Bring in your Census application containing your unique code on it and Hillside's Library staff will help you navigate to the Census site. It will not be necessary for you to have a library card to receive census help. The library will have a computer available specifically for the Census that will NOT require a library card to access.



The Real Estate Boom in Hillside Continues

A January 23rd Crain's Chicago Business article reported Hillside home resale prices increased by more than twice the average of area home resale prices in the Chicago metropolitan area.

Prices rose modestly in 2019 in a majority of the locations that this data covers. Across Chicago, the median price of a home sold in 2019 was up 1.7 percent from 2018, and in the nine-county metropolitan area, the increase was 2.3 percent. **Hillside home resale prices jumped by 5.8%.**

Crain's prepared the data from a report released by the Chicago Association of Realtors and Midwest Real Estate Data that compared 2019 home resale prices to 2018. The study tracks the change in the median sale price in each location, which is the midpoint among sales of all amounts.

This report just confirms what we already know... Hillside is a great place to live and raise a family.

Cada 10 años la información del Censo se recibe por correo a mediados de marzo

Entre el 12 y 20 de marzo, las invitaciones para participar en el Censo se enviarán al 95% de los hogares de los Estados Unidos para la participación que cada uno de nosotros tendremos en el conteo del censo que se realiza cada diez años. El 5% restante son aquellos hogares que tienen apartado postal (P.O. Box) o que se encuentran en áreas remotas y serán entrevistadas por una persona de la oficina del Censo.

Contrario a lo que pasó en pasados censos, la mayor parte de la población NO recibirá la forma del censo para ser llenada. En su lugar, por primera vez, se enviará a los hogares una carta ofreciendo la opción de llenar la forma del censo en línea, que es lo que la oficina del Censo espera que la mayoría de las personas hagan. La carta invitando a que respondan la forma del censo va a tener una identificación única y la dirección del Internet de la oficina del Censo. Esta invitación también tendrá las instrucciones de cómo responder por teléfono. (Hay 12 opciones de distintos idiomas disponibles). La opción 3 es de permitir que las personas soliciten una forma del censo y que se les envíe por correo a ellos. Usted puede requerir que esa forma sea en español.

Fechas importantes de la forma del Censo

1. La carta inicial ofreciendo a la persona la posibilidad de llenar la forma del Censo en línea será enviada por correo entre el 12 y 20 de marzo.
2. Una carta recordándole de llenar la forma le será enviada unos días más tarde.
3. **Si usted no ha contestado para esa fecha:** Una tarjeta le será enviada entre el 26 de marzo y abril 3.
4. **Si usted todavía no ha respondido:** Una carta y un cuestionario le serán enviados entre el 8 y 16 de abril.
5. **Si usted aún sigue sin responder:** Un nuevo aviso final será enviado entre el 20 y 27 de abril antes de que la oficina del Censo lleve un seguimiento en persona.
6. **Todos los hogares que no hayan cumplido llenando el cuestionario del Censo serán visitados por un(a) trabajador(a) de la oficina del Censo a partir del 13 de mayo.**

La información del Censo es confidencial y **NO** se le harán preguntas acerca del estatus de su ciudadanía

Sus respuestas a las preguntas del cuestionario del Censo se mantienen confidenciales por la oficina del Censo de los Estados Unidos. Su información está protegida y no puede ser compartida con ninguna agencia estatal o del gobierno federal. Los resultados del Censo son reportados en términos de números, no nombres son revelados en ningún reporte del Censo.

Preguntas que tienen que ser contestadas en la forma del Censo

- Cuántas personas están viviendo o habitando en su casa el día primero de abril del 2020.

- Si la casa en la que vive es rentada o propia, esto ayuda a crear estadísticas de cuantas personas viven en casa propia o rentada y esta información ayuda en la administración de programas de la vivienda y para la toma de decisiones de planeación de manera informada.

- Acerca del sexo de cada persona en su hogar. Esto le permite a la oficina del Censo a crear estadísticas que se pueden usar en planear y crear fondos para programas de gobierno y también puede ser usado para implementar leyes, regulaciones y reglamentos en contra de la discriminación.

- Acerca de la edad de cada una de las personas en su hogar. La oficina del Censo de los Estados Unidos crea estadísticas para tener un mejor entendimiento del tamaño y las características de la población de acuerdo con la edad de los habitantes. Las agencias usan esta información para planear y financiar programas del gobierno que apoyan programas para individuos de cierta edad, incluyendo niños y personas de la tercera edad.

- Acerca de la raza de cada una de las personas en su hogar. Esto le permite a la oficina del Censo crear estadísticas acerca de la raza y proveer otras estadísticas por grupos raciales. Esta información ayuda a las agencias del gobierno federal a monitorear que se estén cumpliendo las provisiones en contra de la discriminación, tales como la de Ley del Derecho al Voto y la Ley de los Derechos Civiles.

- Acerca si una persona en su hogar es hispano, latino o de origen español. Esto es necesario para que las agencias del gobierno federal puedan monitorear que las leyes en contra de la discriminación se estén implementado. Leyes como la del Derecho al Voto o la Ley de los Derechos Civiles. Nuevamente, debemos de anotar que no habrá preguntas acerca de su ciudadanía.

- Acerca del parentesco o relación con cada persona en su hogar. Esto le permite a la oficina del Censo crear estimados acerca de composición de las familias, los hogares y de otros grupos. La relación de las personas en un hogar es usada para planear o financiar los programas del gobierno que apoyan a las familias, incluyendo personas solas que crían a niños.

¿Qué **no** se le va a preguntar en la forma del Censo del 2020?

La oficina del Censo **nunca le va a preguntar:**

- Su estatus migratorio o el de su ciudadanía.
- Su número del seguro social.
- Nada acerca de su afiliación a un partido político.
- Su cuenta de banco o el número de su tarjeta de crédito.

Se debe de anotar que, si al regresar la forma del Censo ésta está incompleta, a usted le pueden hablar por teléfono o recibirá una visita de un trabajador del censo en su casa.

La biblioteca pública de Hillside tiene computadoras con acceso al internet para aquellos que no tienen esos recursos en sus hogares. Traiga por favor su forma del Censo ya que contiene una identificación única en ella. En la biblioteca, el personal le ayudará a navegar al sitio del Censo. No será necesario que tenga una tarjeta de biblioteca para recibir ayuda del censo. La biblioteca tendrá un computadora disponible específicamente para el Censo que NO requerirá una tarjeta de biblioteca para acceder.

The Law allows villages to opt out of allowing dispensaries to locate within their corporate boundaries. Hillside is taking a wait and see attitude to see how villages who have dispensaries are doing before considering allowing them to locate in our Village. The Village held one public meeting on this subject which was attended by several dozen residents. Villages are prohibited from licensing dispensaries, only the State of Illinois can issue such licenses.

What Does the New Law Allow

Illinois adults may legally possess about an ounce of cannabis flower (30 grams), five grams of cannabis concentrate and cannabis-infused products such as edibles or tinctures with up to 500 milligrams of THC, the active ingredient in marijuana.

Hillside allows adults (21 and over) to use recreational cannabis products in one's own home in rooms where children will not be exposed to the cannabis and also in some cannabis-related businesses.

A landlord, under the law has the right to ban medical or recreational cannabis use in their building, which includes non-smoking consumption of cannabis.

While marijuana has been legalized in Illinois, it's still illegal under federal law. As a result, transporting marijuana across state lines could result in federal criminal prosecution.

Where Cannabis Use Is Prohibited

- In public places such as streets or parks
- In any motor vehicle
- On school grounds
- Near someone under the age of 21
- No use of cannabis in your home's front or back yard
- Near an on-duty school bus driver, police officer, firefighter or corrections officer

- Any business or landlord can prohibit smoking cannabis on their private property

*****If caught violating the law that covers the use of a cannabis related product, a \$50 ticket will be issued.**

Consumers also are urged to avoid ingesting cannabis via e-cigarettes until the cause of a dangerous and sometimes fatal lung disease tied to vaping is determined.

Growing Marijuana

Only medical marijuana patients are allowed to grow plants for personal use. The limit is five plants at a time. Recreational users are not allowed to grow marijuana at home and could be fined up to \$200 if caught violating the law.

Driving Under The Influence

Illinois law states that drivers with THC blood concentration of five nanograms or more are guilty of driving under the influence, regardless of whether the driver appears impaired.

Cannabis can be transported in a vehicle but it has to be sealed in a container that is "reasonably" inaccessible. At no time, even if driving alone, can one use cannabis in a vehicle.

***** Driving under the influence of cannabis related products will be treated the same as a D.U.I. which carries a hefty fine and possible loss of driving privileges.**

Since legal recreational cannabis is new territory for Illinois, the law and the provisions covering its use may evolve over time.

There is DUI Cannabis Task Force that is examining best practices for roadside testing. The Hillside Police Department intends to follow guidance developed by the state task force.

Street Sweeping

Hillside street sweeping resumes in March. Sweep dates for March and April will be March 9-March 13, March 23-March 27, April 6-April 10 and April 20-April 24. Please refrain from parking your car on the street during this time so we can effectively clean our streets.

Yard Waste

Waste Management will resume Yard Waste Pick-up the week of April 1st, and will be picked up on your garbage day. Yard waste (leaves, plant debris, grass clippings, twigs or small branches, etc.) must be placed in your green yard waste cart or a brown yard waste bag. Be sure to have your carts placed on the parkway, or driveway apron the evening before your scheduled pick-up day.

In addition, Waste Management includes branch pickup April through November if you have piles sized approx. 2' long x 2ft. wide x 2' high and bundled with twine for easy pick-up.

Disposal of Televisions and Electronics

The Village Hall, for Hillside residents only, accepts televisions 32" or smaller tube tvs, flat screen 60" or smaller and other electronics such as VCRs, receivers, telephones, etc. This recycling program is **NOT** for small appliances such as toasters, blenders, etc. Goodwill in Westchester accepts tvs, and can be contacted at 708-562-6166. Also, the Village of Burr Ridge has an Electronics Recycling Collection open to everyone. Flood Safety

The following commonsense guidelines can protect you from the dangers of flooding:

- Do not drive through a flooded area. Do not drive around barriers.
- Do not walk through flowing water; currents can be deceptive. Six inches of water can knock you off your feet.
- Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. If your house is about to be flooded, turn off the power at the service box. Electrical current can travel through water. **Electrocution is the second leading cause of death during floods.**
- Be alert to gas leaks. **Turn off the gas to your house before it floods.** If you smell gas, report it to the Fire Protection District, the Village or your gas company. Do not use candles, lanterns or open flames if you smell gas or are unsure if your gas has been shut off.
- Keep children away from flood waters, ditches, culverts and storm drains. Culverts can suck in smaller people, rendering them helpless.
- Clean everything that has been wet. Flood water is contaminated with sewage and other chemicals, which pose severe health threats.
- Look out for animals, especially snakes. Small animals that have been flooded out of their home may seek shelter in yours.
- Do not use gas engines, such as generators, or charcoal fires indoors during power outages. Carbon monoxide exhaust can pose serious health hazards.

Branch Pick-Up

Hillside branch pick-up will begin the **week of March 2nd**, and be picked up **once a month** by the Village of Hillside. **Place your branches on the parkway the Sunday before pick-up week begins.** Our Public Works Dept. documents each street, with the time and date it was completed, so they will not return once they have completed a street. The scheduled dates for pick-up are March 2-6, April 6-10, May 4-8, June 1-5, July 6-10, August 3-7, September 8-11, October 5-9.

GUIDELINES for Branch Pick-up

- **Place branches on parkway the Sunday before pick-up week begins.**
- Entire trees will not be removed. Make arrangements with a hauling service to remove debris when cutting down a tree.
- Branch piles not to exceed 8' long by 5' high by 5' wide.
- Logs 5' or more in diameter must be cut into lengths of 2' or less, stacked and will be picked up separately.
- Bush roots must be removed and will be picked up separately.
- **DO NOT** mix yard waste with branches.

The Hillside Police Provide Tips for Ruse Burglaries and Phone Scams

Utah Couple Loses \$150,000 in Social Security Scam

Every year the Hillside Police Department and agencies all over Illinois receive reports of “Ruse” style burglaries. These types of burglaries tend to target elderly individuals, especially ones that live alone. The offenders use a “ruse” advising they are from the village or water department and they need to check their water meter. After entering the home to look at the water meter, an additional member of the crew comes into the residence. They tend to target the master bedrooms, where money, jewelry and other valuables are kept.

These types of crimes tend to happen during the daytime hours on weekdays. Would-be burglars scout the neighborhoods for elderly residents doing yard work alone. They also have been known to follow potential victims’ home from grocery stores and churches. Many times, the resident does not know they were victimized until later in the day when they notice things missing or until they speak to relatives who alert them that this may have been a scam.



at their door. They can also ask for an ID from the visitor. Never go outside or allow the individual in your house, especially if you can’t verify which company they are with. Keep a notepad by the door and write down a description of their vehicle. Residents can also check with neighbors and ask if they have had anyone approach their home or have any contractors that have a reason to be in the area.

Always call the Hillside Police Department if you have any concerns about someone at your home or for any activity that seems suspicious.

The Hillside Police Department has also received reports of suspicious “Scam” calls. These calls tend to be an automated message stating that you owe the IRS money and they are issuing a warrant for your arrest. The scammers convince the victim to pay them using gift cards, wire transfers and pre-paid debit cards.

According to the IRS Website, these scams cost victims \$23 Million dollars a year. The IRS has also stated that they will **NEVER** call you and demand payment, ask you for your debit or credit card numbers over the phone or even threaten to bring the police to your home to arrest you. If you owe the IRS money, they will send you a letter or a bill in the mail prior to personally reaching out to you.

If you suspect someone is trying to scam you over the phone, hang up and contact the Hillside Police Department. **NEVER** provide personal information over the phone unless you know for a fact who you are speaking with and that they have a valid reason to obtain this information.



Types of Ruse Burglaries:

1. “I’m from the Water Department”.
2. “I’m trimming trees or building a fence for the neighbor and need you to come outside”.
3. “I’m a repair man and noticed some damage to your house that I can fix”.
4. “Asphalt Seal Coating”.

The Village of Hillside will never come to your residence and ask to look at any utilities without first displaying a village ID. All solicitors who are registered with the village will also be provided a permit/ID tag.

Residents can protect themselves from being victimized by utilizing the lock on their screen door when talking to people

School District 87 Referendum on March 17th Primary Ballot

On Monday, December 16, 2019, the District 87 Board of Education voted to approve the resolution for placing a proposition issuing \$105,000,000 in School Building Bonds to voters at the general primary election to be held on March 17, 2020. Voters on that date will decide whether to move forward with funding for new construction and/or renovations that will be accomplished at all of the district's schools.

The vote was based on an intensive two-year-long community-driven Facilities Long-range Planning process that included input from the district's Community Committee; feedback through informational meetings; and surveys from nearly 1,150 community members. In addition, the referendum included research and input from the district's architects, school administrators, staff, families and students.

This plan will allow District 87 to:

- Enhance Learning Environments
- Maintain Smaller Class Sizes
- Improve Infrastructure and Keep Children Safe

The plan includes:

- Construction of a new building to house both Sunnyside and MacArthur Schools, side-by-side.
- Renovation and expansion of both Riley and Northlake Schools
- Improvements to all schools.

The initial estimate for this project was \$111 million. The Board and administration discussed the possibility of potential state funding through capital project grants and tax relief grants, as well as the use of some of the District's fund balance to possibly reduce the total cost to taxpayers.

Careful review by the District's financial consultants and the District administration determined that a final proposed cost of \$105 million was feasible. This is a \$6 million reduction to taxpayers for the total cost of these projects. The District will continue to pursue all available state grants that can be used toward this project.

Final Thoughts from Mayor Joseph T. Tamburino

Dear Neighbors,

A mailer detailing how to fill out the 2020 U.S. Census form will arrive in your mailbox in mid-March; it's critical that everyone in Hillside be counted. For the first time ever, you can choose to fill out the Census form online, by phone or by mail. The Census form ideally is due back by April 1st. Census takers will start visiting non-compliant residences in mid-May for the purpose of having a person living at that address fill out the form. The census is so important that our "Founding Fathers" incorporated it into the U.S. Constitution.

The census data dictates where billions in federal and state dollars will be allocated to help fund vital programs such as education, public safety, health care, infrastructure and veteran programs. It is estimated that our Village will lose approximately \$1,500 annually in government funding per every Hillside person not counted. Thus, 100 non-responding residents will result in a loss of \$150,000 per year and \$1.5 million over the next 10 years.

Census numbers can also be an important factor in economic development. Companies pay close attention to population and many of the demographic indicators that answer questions about workforce availability and quality.

In 2019, two prominent real estate organizations reported that Hillside was one of the few suburban towns experiencing a robust housing market. If every individual fills out the Census Form, we can show the real estate industry (who studies these numbers closely) that unlike many Illinois communities, Hillside did not lose residents and is a vibrant area to move into and raise a family, which in turn keeps our home resale values strong.

Your census answers are strictly confidential and there will be NO questions regarding one's citizenship status.


