

Illinois Appropriates \$25,000,000 to the Illinois Department of Transportation for Butterfield Road Improvement Project... With \$300,000 Allocated for Relocating the Prairie Path

There is misinformation being circulated that the Prairie Path Relocation Project is costing the State of Illinois \$15,000,000. The real cost of the Prairie Path being moved is estimated at only \$300,000.

The Village of Hillside has a thirty-year long history of submitting multiple requests to the Illinois Department of Transportation for improvements to Butterfield Road from Wolf Road to Mannheim Road. Butterfield Road is a roadway operated and maintained by the Illinois Department of Transportation, which cuts through the center of our community and averages daily traffic of over 15,000 vehicles per day annually.

Butterfield Rd

The project was initiated by the urging of the Village of Hillside; however, the design and construction cost will be borne by, managed by, and at the direction of the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Authority. None of the \$25,000,000 to be spent on the project involves Village of Hillside tax dollars.

In 2011, Hillside finally got the greenlight to perform a preliminary engineering study of *Butterfield Road Improvements* under the direction of the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Authority. These initial engineering costs were paid for with Village funds. Under the supervision of these two government agencies,



a Butterfield Road improvement design was developed that would include a center turn lane, curbs, roadway lighting, signal upgrades for pedestrian safety, the elimination of the Wye intersection at Washington Boulevard and Butterfield Road, new sidewalks, and landscaping.

It is the State of Illinois who wants to divert Illinois Prairie Path pedestrian and bicycle traffic from crossing Butterfield Road at North Forest Avenue. The Village was instructed to redirect the Illinois Prairie Path pedestrian and bicycle traffic along the north side of Butterfield Road/ Washington Boulevard to Mannheim Road where they will cross along the western intersection leg. This new route will link Illinois Prairie Path users to the current route which crosses Mannheim Road at the Madison Street signalized intersection.

The relocation of the Illinois Prairie Path will NOT carry a construction cost of \$7,000,000 or the \$15,000,000 as erroneously purported by some. The estimated Prairie Path relocation cost falls more in the range of \$300,000. The relocation of the Prairie Path remains as one (1)



Branch Removal

Branch removal for July will be the week of July 5th through July 8th. Place your branches on the parkway Monday, July 4th and they will be removed that week. August pick up will be August 8th through August 12th. Place branches on the parkway Sunday, August 7th. They will not return once a street has been completed.

Waste Management Branch Pick-Up

In addition to the above branch pickup dates, Waste Management includes branch pickup on your garbage day every week April through November. Piles must be sized approx. 2' long x 2' wide x 2' high and bundled with twine for easy pickup.

Street Sweeping

Street sweeping for the month of July will be the week of July 5th through July 8th, July 11th through July 15th and July 25th through July 29th. For the month of August, the sweeper will be out August 8th through August 12th and August 22nd through August 26th. Please refrain from parking on the street from 6:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. during these dates.

Garbage Removal

Place your garbage, recycle, and yard waste carts out to the curb after 4:00 p.m. the evening before your pick-up day, and no later than 6:00 a.m. the day of your removal. **Note:** Waste Management will remove one large item each week. We recommend calling Waste Management direct @1-800-796-9696 to alert them and receive any special instructions for the item being removed. **Do not place your carts or items in the street.**

Once again, we have been receiving many calls about critters chewing holes in the garbage carts. Things you can do to combat this from happening are to wash the carts regularly and/or double bag your garbage, especially in the summer months. In addition, hanging moth balls inside the cart detours animals, or purchase a rodent deterrent from a hardware store. By cutting down on the smells that animals are attracted to will help eliminate this problem.

Inspection/Public Works Services Information

- A Home Inspection is required if you are planning to sell your house. Please call to get information or come into the Village Hall between the hours of 7a.m. and 3:30p.m., to answer all your questions and be informed about selling your property.
- If you are planning to rent your house, a Village rental inspection is required and must be inspected prior to tenants moving in, along with a final water reading.
- A Sewer Connection Inspection is required for all commercial property selling in the Village. Please call for all the information.
 - NOTE: All inspection fees must be paid prior to scheduling any appointments.
- Permits are required for all work performed by a resident and/or contractor.
 Hillside now accepts permits electronically at www.hillside-il.org/forms. All contractors doing work in Hillside must be licensed and bonded with the Village of Hillside. You can obtain the Contractors Requirements for Permitting by visiting our Village website.

Code Enforcement



50/50 Sidewalk Program

The Village offers the public sidewalk program to all residents that want to replace damaged sidewalk squares under the 50/50 program. If this is something you are interested in, please call Public Works at 708-202-3434 to schedule an appointment to assess the sidewalk condition. We will leave a contract for the recommended replacement with the total cost to you. Please sign the contract, and payment would be required prior to scheduling with our contractor. This work takes place two (2) times per year; late Spring to early Summer and late Summer to Fall. Feel free to call with any questions you may have.



VACANT PROPERTY - All single-family homes in Hillside that will be vacant are required by ordinance (Sec.18-602 Village Code) to be registered with The Village. Property must be secured and maintained to avoid action by Code Enforcement.

Hillside's Camera Enforcement Traffic Program...

Is Keeping Our Village Streets Safer!

The Village of Hillside "Camera Enforcement Program" was initiated to: 1) supplement traffic enforcement within the Village 2) to improve safety in intersections 3) and to reduce the number of accidents. The program's results have shown it to be very successful in improving both safety and reducing accidents.

When comparing the three years, prior to the program getting rolled out to the last three reported years there is a combined 50% reduction in traffic accidents. The intersections monitored had a combined average of 16 accidents per year prior to the installation, and an average of only 8 accidents the last three years. The Village continues to monitor and analyze their traffic enforcement programs to ensure its effectiveness and look for ways to improve safety.

The following statistics DISCLAIMER: The motor vehicle crash data referenced herein was provided by the Illinois Department of Transportation.

The following facts were derived by comparing

 2007-2009 IDOT statistics, which was prior to the designated intersections being monitored beginning in 2010.

IDOT's latest statistics from 2018-2020 regarding the now monitored intersections.

As you can read, three of the four monitored intersections have shown dramatic decreases in accidents. The Roosevelt and Harrison intersection has experienced a slight uptick in accidents, which is being studied on how Hillside can improve traffic safety at this intersection.

Roosevelt & Mannheim, prior to getting the cameras, averaged 26.6 accidents per year. The last three years it has averaged 10.3 accidents per year.

Roosevelt & Wolf, prior to getting the cameras, averaged 17.7 accidents per year. The last three years it has averaged 10 accidents per year.

Roosevelt & Harrison, prior to getting the cameras, averaged 5 accidents per year. The last three years it has averaged 5.6 accidents per year.

Cermak & Wolf, prior to getting the cameras, averaged 14.67 accidents per year. The last three years it has averaged 6.3 accidents per year.

The goal of *Hillside's Camera Enforcement Program* is to continue to reduce these numbers.

Seniors and Disabled Residents, Does Your Lawn Need Mowing??? The Village of Hillside Can Help

Mayor Tamburino, the Village Clerk and the Village Board are offering an exciting grass cutting program for our qualifying seniors and disabled residents.

For \$10 you receive the following services:

- Grass cutting
- Line trimming areas only not accessible by mower
- Blowing of any loose clippings from driveway, sidewalks and patios
- · Hauling away the grass clippings

The program **DOES NOT** include:

- Edging
- Spring/Fall clean up
- Leaf removal
- Fertilization and weed control/aeration/power raking
- Weeding



The following requirements must be met to be eligible for the grass cutting program:


- 1. A person must be 65 years or older, retired and live in a single residence home.
- 2. No able-bodied or employed persons under 65 can reside in the household.
- 3. For those applying due to a disability, you must include documentation provided by the physician treating your condition.

To enroll in this program, please call 708-202-3434 and we will mail you an application form along with information as to where to mail or drop off your filled-out form. Along with your application you MUST show proof of age by including a copy of either your driver's license, state I.D. or birth certificate.

The Village of Hillside will schedule your lawn cutting service. Each month, the Village of Hillside will send out grass cutting service invoices. During the month of June, a senior citizen had their grass cut three times at \$10 per cut, thus they will receive an invoice for \$30. The Village Clerk's Office has NO SOLICITOR stickers you can apply to your front door. Stop by Hillside Village Hall to pick one up.





This year's event was held at the Sheet Metal Workers' Local 73 Union Hall at 4550 W. Roosevelt Rd in Hillside. Over 300 attendees gathered at this year's event for the breakfast which included a full delicious meal of eggs, bacon, sausage, rolls, and fruit with coffee, water, or juice.

The Hillside Community Relations Commission hosts the breakfast annually in recognition of the Village's strong public policy against discrimination, bigotry, and bias, in any form. The purpose of the Commission is to promote and encourage mutual respect, cooperation and understanding between all people, to promote the lawful preservation of human rights of all citizens and to provide all individuals with equal rights.

Another important part of the program each year is the Essay Contest, which includes essays written by children from Hillside schools to promote the theme of the breakfast. The 2022 winners were: Jaelynn Torres and Amia Wilson. Both children from Hillside School were able to read their essay at the breakfast and received a certificate award for their participation. Hillside Trustee Claudell Johnson, who has been instrumental on the Commission, received the Chairman's Award and Lorenzo Weber was presented the "Dream Award" for his involvement in the Community.

AED Defibrators Placed Around Hillside... ... Because Seconds Count When a Cardiac Arrests Occur



As per the American Heart Association, more than 350,000 cardiac arrests occur outside of the hospital each year. In these situations, if performed immediately, CPR can double or triple the chance of survival. The combination of CPR performed immediately including the use of defibrillation exponentially increases a victim's survival rates. A readily accessible automated external defibrillator (AED) unit can allow this lifesaving intervention.

In keeping with the highest standard of public safety, you will be able to find AEDs throughout our Village. The new ZOLL AED Plus defibrillator with Real CPR Help technology guides rescuers in performing high-quality CPR and provides integrated audio and visual feedback to support you throughout the rescue. If you take one of the CPR classes listed in the article below you will be trained to operate these machines.

AEDs are available at the Village Hall. the American Legion Hall on Butterfield Road and the Community Center on Lind Avenue. Our police supervisors have them in their cars with the intent of one day having every Hillside police vehicle supplied with this defibrillator. Of course, every Hillside ambulance has this machine.

pathway not three (3) as *alleged* by others who are misinformed.

In accordance with the Illinois Department of Transportation and Federal Highway Authority requirements, a Public Meeting was held on October 2, 2014, at the Hillside Village Hall where the Phase I Design plans and the Project Development Report were exhibited for public comment and discussion. On December 8, 2015, under the auspices of the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Authority, the Village was authorized to begin the Phase II plan and construction design.

With engineering design in hand, the Village of Hillside waged an intensive lobbying program in Springfield to get an appropriation to start the project. Finally, in 2021, funding in the amount of \$25,000,000 in the Illinois Department of Transportation budget for Butterfield Road improvements was approved.

Once completed Butterfield Road will be safer, will expedite movement of traffic, and look more eye appealing. A target date to begin construction has not been announced but we anticipate a date in the very near future.

I didn't know those 2 men who got killed that day in Korea, all I know is that they got up that day, went to their jobs (servicing aircraft), and they were killed. I am sure they never expected that kind of violence that day. In my mind, they became heroes that day – a tough price to pay for heroism.

I did have an article in mind for this edition, but the mass shooting of children and teachers at an elementary school in Uvalde, Texas has ruined any thoughts. I cannot think about anything else but the victims and the incredible grief their families are going through. I know how I would feel if it were my son or daughter.
