ARTICLE V. - GARAGE SALES

Sec. 66-121. - Intent.

It is the intent of these regulations to prohibit the infringement of any businesses in any established residential area and, in so doing, to regulate the term and frequency of a personal property sale (such as a garage sale, porch sale, basement sale, yard sale and other similar types of sales), thereby avoiding disturbance to or disruption of the residential environment of the area. It is not the intent of these regulations to assume municipal control of infrequent sales by individuals selling but one or a few of their household or personal items in a single transaction.

Sec. 66-122. - Authorized sales.

Any resident may hold a personal property sale or resale of used household, clothing or any other personal property items by means of a garage sale, porch sale, basement sale, yard sale or other similar types of sales.

Sec. 66-123. - Frequency, duration and hours; signs; restriction on items offered for sale; inspections.

Any such sale, limited to two per calendar year per each dwelling unit, shall be conducted only during the hours between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on each of three consecutive calendar days. Notice of the sale shall not be posted more than 24 hours prior to the intended commencement hour of such sale, and such notice shall be removed not more than four hours after the conclusion of such sale. Only items of personal property which are owned by the residents of the premises shall be sold or offered for sale. The resident extends an invitation to any village inspector or officer to enter upon that portion of the premises whereon such a sale is being or is about to be conducted, for the purpose of inspection for or compliance with these regulations, and such inspector or officer may order the sale closed and/or arrest or cause to be arrested any person who is in violation thereof.

Sec. 66-124. - Penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this article shall be subject to punishment as provided in section 1-10 of this Code for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.
