

Mayor Joseph Tamburino's End Of The Year Report

Dear Neighbors,

First of all, I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season.

Let's get right into my review of Village programs and events that occurred in Hillside in 2023.

The year started out with the unveiling of the *Here for Hillside* program under the guidance of newly hired Community Outreach Coordinator Leslie Rios.. Hillside is the first Illinois municipality to initiate this groundbreaking two-way communication program. With *Here for Hillside*, residents can quickly and easily get answers to their questions, find information on Village services, submit service requests, leave a message for staff, or sign up for text message notifications. This is a program you download on a mobile device or laptop. Please visit the Village website at: hillside-il.org and click on the *Here for Hillside* icon that appears in lower right corner of home page. This program is also in Spanish.



Hillside is the first in the state to install Here for Chatbot program to foster better communication with residents Speaking of Spanish, the Village, in 2023 began publishing the Hillside Herald and informational flyers in both English and Spanish to better inform our growing Hispanic population.

We also received some very good news in early 2023 when The Chicago Association of Realtors and Midwest Real Estate Data issued their 2022 year-end report on the housing market in the Chicago area. Hillside was the only town in Proviso Township to post a percentage increase in the number of homes sold between 2021 and 2022. The report also stated that the median sale price of a Hillside home in 2022

increased by 6.4%. These numbers prove that Hillside is a town people see as a place where they can safely pursue their dreams.

As I am writing this report, an interesting number just crossed my desk. Hillside is one of the few villages that offers residents the opportunity to dispose of unwanted electronic devices. A resident can place their old electronics in the blue bins in the Village Hall lobby. In 2023, we hauled away nearly 14,000 lbs. of electronics!




In 2023, nearly 7 tons of discarded electronic equipment placed by residents in the Village Hall Recycling Bins was hauled away

In February, the Hillside Village Trustees approved a proposal by Turnstone Development to construct independent senior housing (55 and over) on the grounds of an unoccupied church located at 5207 Ridge Avenue. This proposed over 55 housing center will NOT be Section 8 housing. It is NOT an assisted living or extended care facility, there will be no medical staff on the site. It is for people 55 and older who want to live an independent lifestyle. As of this report, Turnstone has performed boring samples that prove the ground is adequate for construction. In the next issue of the Hillside Herald, we will answer questions regarding this development and try to clarify some of the misinformation on the scope of this project.

At this point I want to mention a couple of our community events. Very few communities host as many events for its residents as Hillside. Please review pages 17-23 for a pictorial review of many of these events. Our Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Breakfast was sold out as usual. Hillside's very own Emanuel "Chris" Welch. the first African American Speaker of the Illinois House of Representatives, gave a speech on the importance of upholding the principles and legacy of Dr. King.

Our Tree Lighting and Visit with Santa saw a record number of residents in attendance. Nearly 400 children were able to visit with Santa and Mrs. Claus (who made her first appearance). In fact, Santa had to scramble to find more gifts to hand to the children. All the community events owe much of their success to our Special Events Coordinator Evelyn Belmonte.

Our wildly popular *Summer Nights in Hillside* concerts continue to be one of the best summer events in the suburbs. Most nights we saw somewhere between 3,000 and 6,000 concert attendees. This year we presented two concerts at every performance. The music ranged from Latin to classic rock to Motown to modern rock.

In 2017, we had maybe 100 classic cars participate in our Cruise Night. We now welcome nearly 400 cars located on the east side of the concert grounds. Our concert Market Place vendors jumped from 24 in 2017 to 80 booths in 2023. Our food court that started with 12 vendors in 2017 had 23 this year. Our sponsorship money in 2017 was \$20,000, in 2023 we brought in nearly \$90,000. We also earned \$6,000 from the sale of beer. It must be noted that a vast majority of

the concert costs are funded by money from the Hotel Motel tax, which by law must be spent on promoting Hillside. The goodwill created by these concerts are immeasurable and have resulted in positive TV news stories featuring Hillside.

Speaking of Summer Nights Concerts, I want to give a quick shout out to the 15 Hillside Emergency Management volunteers. This team handles parking and traffic control at many Hillside events, which frees up our Police and Firefighters to concentrate on safety issues. It is with sadness that an old friend, Hillside Emergency Management Agency Director Tony Faragia retired this summer after 46 years of working for EMA. Tony served first as a volunteer and then as the Agency's volunteer director. The new director is a long time Emergency Management volunteer, Scott Lundgren.

In early 2023, our state-of-the-art Dispatch Center was chosen to also be the dispatcher for Berkeley fire calls and Westchester police and fire calls. This necessitated changing the dispatch center name to *Proviso Central*. This consolidation will help eliminate the confusion when multiple agencies are dispatched to a call for assistance.

In the Spring, we switched residential refuse collection from Waste Management to Flood Brothers at a cost savings. Also, in April the three incumbent Village Trustees won reelection to new 4-year terms.

In 2023, our Hillside Fire Department was evaluated by the National Insurance Services Office (ISO) and earned a Class 1 grade rating for its fire protection services. ISO's analysis considers suppression capabilities (staffing, equipment, and station location), fire prevention code and code enforcement, training, emergency communications, building codes, and the quality of the water distribution system. This rating results in lower insurance costs for

Hillside businesses and homes in Hillside. Out of 39,850 fire departments nationwide only 388 departments achieved this #1 rating.

In 2023, Hillside Police Chief Murphy reorganized the Department by shifting administrative police personnel back to patrolling

the streets. Hillside now has more officers performing patrol duties than we have had in several years.

In the Spring, the Village Board approved the hiring of *Jensen and Halstead LTD* for architectural and engineering design work associated with the renovation of the Village Hall. This firm will supply the blueprint for moving the library from its present location, a new community room, a gym for our youth, and improved training facilities for our

police and fire departments. This construction will be funded by a state grant.

On March 31st, Senator Richard Durbin held a press conference in front of the Hillside Village Hall to discuss the importance of passing the *Fire Grants and Safety Act*, which would reauthorize the Assistance to Firefighters Grants (AFG) Program and the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Program. These two programs, which supply funding for fire equipment, have brought Hillside nearly \$600,000 since 2005.

In May, the Village Board unanimously voted NO on the construction of a warehouse near Wolf Road and Harrison Street. The Board felt this was not an appropriate use of the land being so close to Hillside School and Proviso West High School.

Our Hillside Youth Commission had a busy 2023. They sponsored the following events for our children: Family Bowling Extravaganza, Easter Egg Hunt, a hands-on Reptile Show, a Game Truck Day, Halloween Costume/Bonfire Night, Tree Lighting and Santa Visit Event.

We were once again awarded the "Government Finance Officers Association Award". This award is given for Excellence in Government Finance that recognizes innovative programs and contributions to the practice of government finance that exemplify outstanding financial

management. We have received the 9th most GFOA awards in Illinois with 187 Illinois municipalities never having earned this prestigious award.

Police Department

- Restarted bike patrol after several years of inactivity and employed the unit for the Summer Nights Concerts.
- Implemented UAS (Drone) program.
- Expanded the ALPR (license plate reader) system to cover more of the village to assist in the prevention and investigation of criminal activity.
- Started the Barnacle Immobilization Program which impairs windshield visibility on vehicles that have amassed 5 or more unpaid parking tickets.
- Introduced a new special events uniform for the officers, making them more visible and easier to identify in crowds.
- Hired a new officer, Robert Zebrauskas, who graduated from the police academy on December 15, 2023.
- In May, Hillside Officers participated in Cop on a Rooftop at Dunkin Donuts, raising over \$6,000.00 for Illinois Special Olympics.
- In June, Officers participated, for the first time, in the Law Enforcement Torch Run with the surrounding towns to raise money for the Illinois Special Olympics, running from Forest Park through Maywood, Broadview, and Westchester and ending in Hillside at the Sheet Metal Union Hall.
- Sgt. Zach Sienkiewicz attended Northwestern University Center for Public Safety's School of Police Staff & Command. This course is a combination of academic principles with practical applications. The 10-week curriculum zeroes in on such critical command-level content as planning and policies, media relations, organizational behavior, budgeting and resource allocation, human resources, contemporary policing, and more.
- Offered a *Ride Along with a Cop Program* for residents.
- Performed 83 home watches for residents on vacation.
- Consolidated dispatch services with Berkeley and Westchester. This is now done in the dispatch center in the Hillside Village Hall.

Fire Department

- Responded to over 3,000 emergency calls, most of which were for paramedic assistance.
- In 2023, the Hillside Fire Department received new grading as an ISO 1 community for the second time in a row. Last grading was in 2017. ISO currently grades 38,000 fire departments. The Hillside Fire Department is 1 of 29 fire departments in Illinois that is rated ISO Class 1. They are also one of the 487 fire departments out of 38,000 in the United States with a Class I rating. This rating is based on how prepared a department is in handling emergencies.
- Awarded a FEMA AFG Grants for \$61,659 the purchase of new battery-operated extrication tools, new Thermal Imaging Cameras, and new air rescue high pressure lift bags and

controllers.

- Installed 18 residential smoke alarms, 12 Knox Boxes, and 12 child safety car seats.
- Took delivery of past grant awards for new portable radios, mobile vehicle radios and back-up base station radios.
- Purchased 6 sets of new turnout gear to replace the aging non-compliant NFPA turnout gear.
- Replaced over 30 lengths of new fire hose to replace the 20 year old hose.
- Hosted the third annual FD Open House for 2023 at the fire station that was attended by scores of Hillside residents.
- Celebrated the retirement of two Fire Captains who provided over 45 years of combined service to the community.
- Promoted two new Captains and two new Lieutenants.
- K9 Handler FF/PM Katie Boeke and her dog Fable responded to 19 calls for victim search assistance with the K9/Drone Team and MABAS ILTF-1 throughout 2023. K9 Handler FF Katie Boeke and Fable received National Type 1 K9 certification.
- Took delivery of a new 2024 Ford F450 Type 3 Horton Ambulance.
- Purchased new equipment to adapt to the new changing vehicle technology for electric vehicle incidents. Also added vehicle fire blanket for Electric Vehicle fires and an Emergency Plug for non-fire Electric Vehicle emergency incidents.
- The department held 15 CPR classes for businesses and individuals.
- The Hillside Fire Department presented the *Remembering When Program* at the Hillside Community Center during Senior Social Group meetings in March and October. This program deals with instructing seniors on safety issues to prevent falls.

Our top-rated Fire Department continued its excellent work in interacting with the community.

• Fire Department personnel attended various Village and non-Village events including Village "Egg-Citing Easter event, Summer Nights concert series, Autumnfest, Halloween, Tree Lighting, Back-to-School event, Anthony Raymond Memorial Service, Chris Welch back-to-School event at Proviso West, Senator Kimberly Lightford 13th annual Back-to-School event at Brookfield Zoo, Autism & Development Disabilities Walk-A-Thon at PWHS, First Responder Career Expo at Triton College, Youth Commission Family Bowling Event, and many more.

Public Works

- New salt storage dome was constructed. (The original dome was destroyed by a storm in 2022).
- 9,150 LF of sanitary sewer main cleaned and televised.
- 26 water main breaks were repaired.
- 39 new residential trees were planted.
- 46 Village trees were assessed and deemed diseased or dead and were removed.
- 58 residential and commercial water meters were upgraded and installed.

Summary of Other Public Works Duties in 2023

In addition to above, Public Works has worked hard in 2023 completing a large list of tasks to keep our Village looking great. This includes tasks such as garbage and debris removal on Village property, branch removal, trimming bushes and trees, cutting grass, watering

In 2023, in addition to the taxi program snd grass cuting services for seniors and those with disabilities, Hillside also provided snow removal

plants and grass, maintaining dig sites. Also maintain Hillside's portion of the Prairie Path, TOT parks, Village Commons, removing dead animals, etc. In addition, they were busy keeping our streets safe when it comes to removing snow and salting our streets, filling potholes, keeping Village lights in working order, cleaning up storm damage, repairing and replacing street signs, etc. They have also spent many hours on vehicle maintenance, reading water meters, taking water samples, maintaining/replacing water meters, maintaining all Village property, just some of what keeps them busy.

For 2023, Public Works was busy repairing and maintaining the water system when breaks occurred, several fire hydrant

repairs, investigating and repairing service leaks, rodding and jetting of sewer lines to clear blockages and making curb drain repairs. They have worked with contractors to restore areas that have been previously repaired and that need street, curb, and parkway restoration.

Public Works does the set-up for all Village events, which there are many. Once again, they were quite busy with the largest event in Hillside that is the Summer Nights in Hillside concert series, which runs smoothly every year thanks in large part to our Public Works Department.

Community Outreach Events

• ComEd's Powering the Holidays Grant

ComEd's Powering the Holidays Program awarded the Village of Hillside a grant of \$2,500 to support community-based lights event. The Village of Hillside utilized this grant for our annual tree lighting ceremony and a Special Visit with Santa event. In partnership with the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus, the grant program, established in 2021, celebrates local communities' identity and culture by supporting holiday programs that promote intercultural exchange and provide a pathway for all members of these communities to gain a sense of belonging.

Vaccine Clinics

Throughout the year, the Village of Hillside hosted several vaccine clinics as a part of its health initiative.

• Tax Appeal Workshops

As a part of its community outreach efforts, Hillside conducted multiple tax appeal workshops throughout the year. These workshops serve to educate and assist community members in understanding the tax appeal process, providing valuable information and resources. By offering these workshops, Hillside aims to actively engage with the community, address their concerns, and empower individuals to navigate an important aspect of their financial rights and responsibilities.

• 2023 Community Happenings

Very few villages offer its residents the number of events for people of all ages. The following are a few of the events that bring our community together:

• Hillside Senior Social Group

In her first full year on the job, our Senior Coordinator Janice O'Connor, revved up events for the Hillside Senior Social Group. This group is for Hillside residents 60 and over. Under Janice's leadership the club meets twice a month. In 2023, the group attended two plays at Drury Lane and took a Chicago Riverboat Architectural Tour in June. They also had a Valentine's Day party, St. Patrick's Day gathering, a BBQ cookout, a Thanksgiving dinner, and a Christmas celebration. See page 11 for information on the group's upcoming Casino Trip. Hillside Public Works Report

Snow Accumulation:

Snow, ice, and freezing temperatures are the winter norm and Hillside Public Works salt trucks and snowplows are ready to go! Parking is not permitted on any public street within the Village when snow accumulation reaches three inches (3") or more until snow removal operations are completed.

Please do not shovel or blow snow <u>into or across</u> any public street or sidewalk. (Code of Ordinance Section 9.108.1). Icy patches and frozen blocks of ice can form which are a danger to pedestrians and vehicles. The Village does not clear neighborhood sidewalks. Please be a snow angel and shovel your sidewalk so school children and pedestrians can walk with greater ease and safety. Clearing snow from around fire hydrants and storm sewers would be greatly appreciated. <u>Please keep the snow on your own property and parkway.</u>

Snowplow Safety

Stay safe around snowplows by keeping your distance. A snowplow driver's field of vision is restricted. You may see them, but they may not see you. Watch for sudden stopping or turning. Plows are wide and can cross center lines. Do not tailgate and do not pass. Snowplows tend to go under the speed limit. Be patient and allow plenty of time to slow down. **Take it slow and be safe this Winter!**

Senior Snow Plowing

If you are part of the Senior Snow Removal, please be sure your addresses are clearly displayed or lit up. This is helpful when it becomes dark, and the driver is trying to identify an address. This is also recommended in the case of an emergency. The minutes it takes to find the address could make a difference.

Garbage and Recycle Carts

Garbage and recycling carts, by Ordinance (Article 1, Sec. 70-33), must be put out on the parkway and **NOT IN THE STREET**. The Public Works Department is unable to maintain our streets (snow plowing) with these obstacles on the street.

To ensure pick-up on your scheduled day, the Village highly recommends placing your garbage out on the parkway any time after 4:00 p.m. the day before your scheduled pick-up day to ensure pick-up the following morning.

Holiday Schedule for Flood Brothers

If a holiday falls on a weekday or a Sunday, and your regularly scheduled pickup is on or after the holiday, your pickup will be delayed by one day. Friday customers will be serviced on Saturday. Flood Brother will not collect on the following holidays: New Years, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Water Bill Payments

Drop Box - A 24 hour drop box is in the Hillside Village Hall parking lot at 425 N. Hillside Avenue. It is located to the right when entering the parking lot.

Late Payments – Payments must be received in our office by the due date to avoid a 5% penalty charge. Failure to receive a bill or payment by the due date does not excuse the late charge. Payments must be received, not postmarked, by the Due Date to avoid the penalty charge.




