HILLSIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT IMPLEMENTS DRONE PROGRAM

Recently, the Hillside Police Department implemented a program that deploys an Unmanned Aerial System (UAS), commonly known as a drone. We currently have one operational drone along with an FAA certified drone operator. The drone program debuted at our first summer concert on July 18th of this year. If you attended any of these events, you may have seen the drone in use as it assisted the village in many ways during these well attended events.

Besides giving us a unique bird's eye view, the drone could also quickly respond to an area of concern much faster than an officer could on foot. This helped keep personnel available for other duties. The drone also assisted in monitoring traffic and parking conditions to help facilitate how we managed the large crowd's entry and exit, as well as resource planning from week to week, such as artificial lighting or barricade placement. Finally, the drone was able to provide overhead pictures from the event that gave us the most accurate crowd size estimates we have ever had.

The drone is not just useful during these events, but has a role in assisting other police operations. The drone can be quickly deployed to help search for a missing child or adult. Giving us an extra set of eyes that can cover large areas much quicker than a traditional ground search is able to. This same approach can be used to locate offenders that may flee from a crime scene. The drone can also enhance the safety of our officers by locating offenders from a distance and giving officers on the ground advanced warning of potential threats these offenders may pose.

It is important to note that the Hillside Police Department has a strict policy regarding the use of drones. This policy ensures that the program is used properly by complying with state and federal laws and is always mindful of citizen's right to privacy. Pictures or videos captured by the drone can only be used in specific circumstances and will never be transmitted to the public or on social media unless there is a vital reason to do so regarding personal or public safety. The policy also requires advanced notice to the public that the drone will be used during a planned event.

Always keep one eye to the sky, especially at village events, you never know when you might see our newest, and possibly coolest, addition to the Hillside Police Department.

George Cross Will Be Hillside's Veterans Day Parade Grand Marshal At 101 Years Old!

According to the US Department of Veterans Affairs statistics, approximately 167,284 of the 16 million Americans who served in World War II are alive in 2023. In view of this statistic, the Village of Hillside is honored to have 101-year-old Hillside resident George Cross serve as Grand Marshal for the Village's Veterans Day Parade on November 4th.

Mr. Cross was born in Kansas City, Missouri in 1922. His family tree includes direct descendants of Dred Scott, who petitioned the Supreme Court to remove his enslaved status. The famous Dred Scott Decision ruled that Dred Scott, as a Black man, had no right to sue to correct a decision of any Court. This decision paved the way for the presidential election of Abraham Lincoln 3 years later.

Mr. Cross spent his formative years in the southern Illinois towns of Carmi, Marion and Villa Ridge. Mr. Cross saw education as critical for advancement in any field of endeavor. He attended Illinois State University to pursue a degree in Education and Biological Science. Mr. Cross was a basketball Forward for Illinois State University. World War II deferred his dream, as he was drafted into the US Army during that conflict.

In the Army, Mr. Cross served as a Water Service Supervisor in New Guinea and the Philippines. Ultimately, he achieved the important rank of Sergeant, and was charged with the key responsibility to ensure that polluted water would not devastate the rank-and file. His decorations include the Asiatic-Pacific Theater Ribbon, two Bronze Battle Stars for serving in a war zone, the Philippine Liberation Ribbon, a Bronze Star, a Good Conduct metal and a WW II Victory Medal.

When Mr. Cross ended his military service in 1946, he returned to Illinois State University to complete his Bachelor's degree. Furthering his education, he also earned an MS degree in Educational Administration with a minor in Chemistry.

Mr. Cross taught at several Illinois and Missouri schools for more than 35 years. During his tenure, he served as a Guidance Counselor and also taught Math, Science, and Physical Education.

Mr. Cross coached high school basketball players from 1952 – 1969. In 1962, Mr. Cross became the first African American high school coach in Missouri to take a team of African American basketball players to the State's Final Four competition. In 1969 while he taught and coached at Hadley Tech High School in St. Louis, Hadley's team won the State Championship in Basketball for the Public School League. Some of his former students have stated that "his commitment to mentorship both on and off the court was invaluable." He retired as Assistant Principal of Vashon High School (formerly Hadley Tech) in 1978.

Mr. Cross and his late wife Althea were married for 71 years. They had one son who is also deceased. Due to his strong commitment to charitable service, he became a member of the Phi Delta Kappa fraternity. He also served as President of the Retired Teachers Association's Executive Board, where he was treasurer for more than 15 years.

Mr. Cross lives in Hillside with his daughter-in-law Haroleon Cross. He is the proud grandfather of one and greatgrandfather of two.

George Cross is a joy to everyone he meets and has a smile for everyone. He is the embodiment of honesty and compassion. He is a strong advocate of discipline and goal setting, which he believes are key to achieving. Hillside is proud to call this fine gentleman its Veterans Day Parade Grand Marshal for 2023.

Hillside Public Works Report

We wish you a very happy, healthy, safe holiday season.

LEAVES

Dispose of leaves in your green yard waste cart or brown yard waste bags that can be placed out after 4:00 p.m. the evening before your scheduled pick-up day. **Blowing or raking leaves into the street is a violation of Village Ordinance.**

YARD WASTE

REMINDER: The last yard waste pick-up will be the week of November 27th on your scheduled pick-up day.

BRANCH PICK-UP

The Village branch pick-up has ended for 2023. However, Flood Brothers accepts bundles of brush or limbs, providing the bundles do not exceed a weight of 50 lbs., and no more than 4' long and 2" in diameter. Small limbs can be placed in your yard waste cart. The last pickup for yard waste carts and branches is the last week of November 27th on your scheduled garbage day pickup. The Village Branch chipper route will resume in April 2024. Be sure to read The Herald for start dates.

RECYCLING INFORMATION

<u>Please do not place plastic bags in your blue recycle cart!</u> There are many items that can be recycled by using your blue recycling container. Some items **NOT** to recycle are **plastic bags**, plastic #6 (polystyrene), k-cups, food or beverage waste including fast food packaging/plastic utensils, candy and snack wrappers, paper towels, Styrofoam, electronics, car batteries, light bulbs, tires, hoses, shower curtains, and hazardous materials.

NOTE TO OUR RESIDENTS

Garbage, recycling, and yard waste carts, by Ordinance (Article 1, Sec. 70-33), must be put out on the parkway and **NOT IN THE STREE**T. The Public Works Department is unable to maintain our streets (sweeping, snow plowing) with these obstacles on the street. **Please place your carts on the parkway.**

STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping is scheduled every week for the month of November and the first week of December, which usually takes place at the beginning of the week, weather permitting. That will conclude street sweeping until March of 2024. Please refrain from parking on the streets from 6:00 am until 4:30 pm during these dates.

SNOW REMOVAL

Parking is not permitted on any public street or alley within the Village when snow accumulation reaches three inches (3") or more, and until snow removal operations are completed. PLEASE DO NOT SHOVEL OR BLOW SNOW INTO OR ACROSS ANY PUBLIC STREET OR SIDEWALK (CODE OF ORDINANCE'S SEC. 74-9). Icy patches and frozen blocks of ice form, creating hazardous conditions for pedestrians and vehicles. Please keep the snow on your own property and parkway.

STREETLIGHTS

It's that time again when our days are becoming shorter and darker. Please report the outage of streetlights to the Public Works and Inspection Services Department. We don't always know about a streetlight that is out or malfunctioning. That's why we need the help of the community to get the lights back on and keep our Village lit up! **Please call 708-202-3434.**

Going to the Mall for You Holiday Shopping? Then Use The Village of Hillside's 50/50 Taxicab Program

This holiday season, take the stress out of driving around looking for that perfect gift by using **The Village of Hillside's 50/50 taxicab reimbursement program**. Unlike other government bus or taxi programs that limit your travel to within the Village limits, Hillside's program allows you to travel anywhere in Chicago and the suburbs. To participate in the 50/50 Taxicab Program, here is all you need to do:

- Be a Hillside resident, 60 years and over, or be 16 years or over with a disability.
- Enroll in the program at the Hillside Village Hall, 425 N. Hillside Avenue. Please bring proof of age such as a driver's license, state I.D. card, birth certificate, etc.
- Once enrolled, the Village will issue you a permanent taxicab I.D. card to purchase your 50/50 taxicab coupons. Coupons can only be purchased at the Village Hall during regular business hours.
- Coupons are sold in \$10.00 booklets you pay \$5.00, and the Village of Hillside pays the remaining \$5.00.
- American Taxi (847-255-9614) and Blue Cab (708-583-6900) are the only taxicab companies that accept the 50/50 coupons.
- Coupons can pay for the entire fare, including the tip; or you can use the coupons for the fare and tip the driver in cash the choice is yours.
- The coupon allows you to bring up to three friends of any age on your trip at no additional cost. For more information about this innovative and exciting Taxicab Program, please call 708-449-6450.

Helpful 50/50 Taxi Program Hints:

- **Call** at least one hour before you need to be picked up; preferably one day in advance.
- Advise the cab company if you will be requiring special assistance.
- Mention that you have Village of Hillside 50/50 Senior Citizen Ride coupons.
- **Report** lost or stolen coupons to the Village of Hillside immediately at 708-449-6450.

Stay Safe and Be Informed... Register for Hillside's CodeRED Program Today

Be Informed about tornado sightings, street closures, and much more by registering for Hillside's **CodeRED** Program. Along with emergency and critical messages like tornado sightings and flood warnings, the **CodeRED** notification system can also enhance our community engagement via the release of important yet nonemergency information. This information ranges from road closures to trash collection schedule changes, and other services.

CodeRED enables us to communicate with our residents through text, phone, email, and social media. Whether from the field or from our offices, we are able to provide the information residents need to know to help them make better informed decisions.



Registration for the **CodeRED** service is customized, allowing residents to choose which alerts they'd like to sign up for and how they would prefer to receive them. Residents can choose several different methods: landline, cell phone, email, text message, TTY, or even a combination. These alerts can be specific to streets, neighborhoods, or regions so that residents in affected areas are sure to receive this valuable information. Residents can keep track of alerts in Hillside or while traveling with the **CodeRED** Mobile App, which notifies smartphone holders of real-time alerts in the area. We can launch alerts from anywhere at any time right to a resident's smartphone. This all happens within seconds, which can make a huge difference in saving lives.

Keep Loved Ones Safe This Holiday Season and All Year Round with Hillside's Smart911 Program



Over 80% of calls made to 911 come from mobile phones. When you dial 911 from a mobile phone, the 911 call takers have very little information to help you – only your phone number and a very general sense of your location. This is a serious problem in an emergency when seconds count, particularly if you or your loved ones have medical conditions or are unable to safely speak. The easy solution to this problem is registering for **Smart911**.

What is Smart911?

Smart911 is a free service used by public safety agencies across the country to enhance communication and response for their community. It can be used by 911 agencies to quickly send first responders to the location of an emergency with more information; by emergency management

personnel to better plan for and respond to disasters; and by municipalities to send notification to their citizens.

The 911 service of **Smart911** allows you to create a Safety Profile for your household. This will proactively provide details on your family and home that 911 may need in order to send help in the event of an emergency no matter where you are in the United States.

How does Smart911 work?

When you sign up for **Smart911**, you can create a secure Safety Profile that will display on the call taker's screen whenever you dial 911 in the event of an emergency. You can add as much or as little to your profile as you want, the choice is yours, but it is recommended you add important details responders need to know during an emergency situation. This may include medical conditions and medications, address details, and photos of yourself, children, or any elderly relative prone to wandering.

How does Smart911 help?

Better informed first responders are better equipped to help you. With Smart911, paramedics are aware of critical medical information like Alzheimer's or allergies. Police have children's photos in case of an Amber Alert and Firefighters know household details – ensuring that everyone is rescued during an evacuation – even pets.

How do I register?

The registration process is quick and easy. Start by visiting the Hillside Village Website www.hillside-il.org and then click on the tab Village Services. In the drop-down menu under Public Safety click on the **Smart911** tab and scroll to the bottom where it says Signup for **Smart911**. After completing the steps, you will have a chance to add optional information or edit the information you have provided. You must complete every step. The service will not work until you have added and confirmed a phone number. For additional information, call the non-emergency fire department phone number at (708) 547-8684.



Start the 2024 Year Off Right... Have the Hillside Fire Department Install a Free Smoke Detector!



Secretary of State Initiates Programs to Cut Down on Wait Times at Motor Vehicle Facilities

In an effort to improve customer service and eliminate the unpredictability of wait times at Illinois DMVs, Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias has implemented a Skip-the-Line Program starting in September.

• The Skip-the-Line Program includes:

Simplified Online Services — Customers are encouraged to take advantage of the many services offered online at ilsos.gov, including renewing their driver's license or ID card and license plate sticker online.



Appointment Scheduling – Customers will be required to make appointments for in-person visits at 44 of the busiest DMVs including all Chicago and suburban locations for those seeking REAL ID, driver's license and ID card services, and in-car driving tests. Those seeking vehicle-related services, such as title and registration or renewing their license plate sticker, do not need to make an appointment and can just walk in. Upon arrival, customers will check in with DMV staff and "Skip the Line," eliminating lines and unpredictable wait times. Illinoisans may visit ilsos.gov or call (844) 817-4649 to schedule an appointment.

• New Extended Hours of Operation — All DMVs statewide will extend hours of operation, with 16 facilities open six days a week – Monday through Saturday.

• All DMVs will change their days and hours of operation from Tuesday-Saturday to Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-5:30 p.m.

• 16 DMVs will also be open on Saturday, 8 a.m.-12:30 p.m., see below.

"Customers will save time by skipping the line," said Giannoulias. "Our goal is to eliminate the Time Tax that has plagued Illinoisans for years, forcing them to stand in long lines wasting time – just to conduct basic services. Extending hours at all DMVs and requiring appointments at our 44 highest-volume facilities are the most efficient way to get the services you need quickly and without the headache of unpredictable wait times."
