

Car Batteries, Explosives, Tires, any type of Fluid (gas, oil, etc.), Ammunition, Radioactive Material, Riding Lawnmowers/ Snow Blowers, Hazardous or Medical Waste, Large Automobile Parts, Boats, Snowmobiles, Bricks, Concrete Blocks, Cement or Asphalt Pavement Material, Construction, and Demolition Debris.

#### Seniors and Disabled Residents... Have the Village of Hillside Mow Your Lawn for \$10!!!

Mayor Tamburino, the Village Clerk and the Village Board are offering an exciting grass cutting program for our qualifying seniors and disabled residents.

#### For \$10 you receive the following services:

- Grass cutting
- Line trimming areas only not accessible by mower
- Blowing of any loose clippings from driveway, sidewalks and patios
- Hauling away the grass clippings

The program **DOES NOT** include:


- Edging
- Spring/Fall clean up
- Leaf removal
- Fertilization and weed control/aeration/power raking
- Weeding

#### The following requirements must be met to be eligible for the grass cutting program:

- 1. A person must be 65 years or older, retired and live in a single residence home.
- 2. No able-bodied or employed persons under 65 can reside in the household.
- 3. For those applying due to a disability, you must include documentation provided by the physician treating your condition.


To enroll in this program, please call 708-202-3434 and we will mail you an application form along with information as to where to mail or drop off your filled-out form. Along with your application, you MUST show proof of age by including a copy of either your driver's license, state I.D. or birth certificate.

The Village of Hillside will schedule your lawn cutting service. Each month, the Village of Hillside will send out grass cutting service invoices. During the month of June, a senior citizen had their grass cut three times at \$10 per cut, thus they will receive an invoice for \$30. #### **IMPORTANT...** Before You Dig Call JULIE

Summer is time for construction or remodeling projects performed around the exterior of a home. Before you dig, please call JULIE by dialing 811 on your phone to set up an appointment for the JULIE team to stop by and determine where utility lines are buried. The service is free, and you can call or visit their website 24 hours a day 365 days of the year. This service assists homeowners and contractors from accidentally knocking out utility service in the neighborhood.





#### **BRANCH PICK-UP**

Branch pick-up for the month of May will be the week of May 1st through May 5th. For the month of June, the pick-up week is June 5th through June 9th. Place branches out on the parkway the Sunday before the pick-up week to be assured your branches will be picked up. Public Works documents each street with the date and time it was completed. THEY WILL NOT RETURN ONCE A STREET HAS BEEN COMPLETED.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR BRANCH PICK-UP**

- Entire trees will not be removed. Make arrangements with a hauling service to remove debris when cutting down an entire tree.
- Branch piles are not to exceed 8' long by 5' high by 5' wide.
- Logs 5' or more in diameter must be cut into lengths of 2' or less, stacked and will be picked up separately.
- Bush roots must be removed and will be picked up separately.
- Do not mix yard waste with branches.

#### FLOOD BROTHERS NEW TRASH PICKUP FIRM STARTING MAY 1ST

Waste Management is no longer Hillside's refuse collector. Starting May 1st, Flood Brothers will be collecting your trash. Your collection day and the type of items or trash you can put out at the curb remains the same. May 29th collection day will be moved back one day due to the Memorial Day holiday.

#### STREET LIGHTS

Do you see streetlights out in the Village? If so, please report the outage to the Public Works/Building Services Dept. at 708-202-3434. We don't always know about a streetlight that is out, or one that is turning off and back on again, which indicates the light is failing to work properly. That's why we need the help of the community to get the lights back on, and keep the Village lit up!!

#### **CODE ENFORCEMENT**

Dog and Cat Tags are available at the front counter of The Village Hall at no charge. Please bring your pets up to date shot records. Please go to the Village of Hillside website at: www.hillside-il.org and then click on Community tab and on the popup menu that next appears, click on Pets of Hillside to read the Village Code regarding animals.

#### WARNING, PLEASE READ

There have been reports in the area of distemper found in animals. Clinical signs of canine distemper may include discharge from the nose and eyes, a rough coat of hair, emaciation, and neurological signs such as tremors, incoordination, and unusual behavior.


It also can infect dogs, raccoons, foxes, coyotes and cats. The virus infects the lungs, airways, nose, and eyes. It can also infect the brain and suppress the immune system. Distemper can cause serious illness and death in these animals. Protect your pets.

Keep children and pets away from these animals and other wildlife. Be sure to avoid exposure between domestic animals and wildlife, and ask your veterinarian about ensuring your pets are up to date on their vaccinations. Immediately report any possible exposure (e.g., bites or scratches from skunks, raccoons, or other wildlife) of people or pets to your physician or veterinarian, respectively, and the county health department. Do not leave pet food outside and eliminate other attractants (secure garbage cans, do not feed wildlife). If you find a wild animal that is sick or injured, please contact a licensed wildlife rehabilitator.

#### **Modern Technology Helping Hillside Police in Fighting Crime**

In the September-October Hillside Herald, we published an article on Hillside employing the Flock License Plate and Vigilant ALPR systems. We decided to do a follow-up to see how the new system is working.

The Hillside Police Department began using Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR's) in 2022. The department employs three stationary ALPR's and two portable units that can easily be moved and placed where needed. The department also recently deployed a marked squad car that has readers attached to it and can be used while the vehicle is being driven. Hillside currently employs both the FLOCK and Vigilant ALPR systems and has permits to install four more readers soon.



The ALPR's are not video cameras, they only capture a still image of the front or back of a vehicle to include the license plate. This data is then stored and can be retrieved to assist our agency in solving crimes within the village. License plates that are involved in criminal activity can also be added to a "Hotlist" so we can be notified if these cars are in the area and give our officers time to intercept them before they may commit a crime. The data that is collected, per policy, can only be accessed with a legitimate law enforcement purpose, and the Department has a process to monitor the accessing and use of the data.

Amazingly, in the past 30 days alone, the ALPR's have read over 500,000 plates! Just this year, the department used the ALPR's to recover seven stolen autos, to solve a burglary, and to detect numerous vehicles wanted in



relation to felonies committed in other jurisdictions. The biggest benefit we have seen is the Department's ability to recover most of these vehicles without a pursuit. This has resulted in increased public safety along with increases in arrests and recoveries. The Department is confident that these systems have prevented many crimes by being able to intercept vehicles involved in criminal activity by getting an alert and dispatching officer(s) to the area to discourage any illegal activity.

The systems can also identify vehicles related to Amber and Silver alerts to help officers to locate missing persons that may travel through our area. ALPR's and Flock systems are becoming a useful and common tool for police agencies around the country. As always, the Hillside Police Department is one of the leaders in the area to utilize these systems to better serve our community.

#### Learn About Hillside's Barnacle Vehicle Immobilization Program



The Hillside Police Department is implementing the use of *the Barnacle vehicle immobilization device* for parking violators. The Barnacle is a mechanism, like the Denver Boot, to immobilize cars whose owners have 5 or more unpaid parking tickets. It is a lightweight device made mostly of plastic and is a bright yellow piece of equipment that nearly covers the front windshield, sticking to it with, according to Barnacleparking.com, 1,000 pounds of force.

The department will notify owners of vehicles that have 5 or more unpaid parking tickets that their vehicle is subject to the *Barnacle Vehicle Immobilization Program.* Once a Barnacle is applied to a vehicle, the owner has 48 hours to call the phone number on the device to get the Barnacle released. After 48 hours, if the vehicle owner has not made arrangements to pay the fines, the vehicle may be towed. The department started notifying vehicle owners in March that their vehicle is subject to the immobilization program.

## Voters Re-Elect Village Trustee Incumbents in April 4th Election



On April 4th, nearly 14% of eligible Hillside voters cast their ballots in the Village Trustee election. After weeks of candidates campaigning, door knocking, phone calling, political mailings, and social media messaging, the voters finally had their say and reelected the three incumbent Village Trustees.


## Ship Ahoy Hillside Senior Club

#### Hillside Fire Captain Ryan Wyckoff Securing Programs That Make Hillside Safer

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) "Assistance to Firefighters Grants Program" (AFG), and "Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response" (SAFER) grant funds provide critically needed resources to fire departments for equipment, to train emergency personnel, enhance efficiencies, and support community resilience. Applying and being awarded these grants is a very labor intensive and methodical process and is never guaranteed.

The initial review phase for every application is a computer review to score the request on how closely it is aligned with the AFG goals and priorities. If your application has a sufficient score, it is sent to a three-person peer review committee which reads and scores your narrative.

To make it through this extensive process and ultimately being awarded Federal funds you need a very good grant writer. Hillside Fire Department (HFD) Captain Ryan Wyckoff throughout the years, has had tremendous success in writing and being awarded FEMA AFG and SAFER grants.

As the Fire Department's Grant Manager, Captain Wyckoff has seen Hillside awarded six AFG grants for self-contained breathing apparatuses, mobile and base station radios, Thermal Imaging Camera, SCBA filling compressor, Cardiac Monitor, and Automatic CPR devices, **totaling just over \$5.1 million dollars**. Ryan also authored a grant which brought in over \$800,000 for the purchase of a new aerial ladder truck.

Securing SAFER grant money, the Hillside Fire Department was able to hire five personnel in 2013, and three more in 2019, covering both salaries and benefits 100% for 3 years. In 2015 and again in 2021, Captain Wyckoff received two AFG Regional grants which helped, not only the Hillside Fire Department, but also benefited multiple neighboring fire agencies with purchasing of new equipment.

The Village of Hillside Fire Department would like to congratulate Captain Wyckoff on his success, hard work, and dedication in helping the HFD secure these additional funds, and ensuring that the Hillside Fire Department continues to be one of the premier fire departments in the western suburbs.

#### It's Garage Sale Time in Hillside

Permits are Free and can be obtained at the Hillside Village Hall

#### The following rules must be followed:

- Garage sales are limited to two a year for a Hillside dwelling unit.
- Garage sales shall be conducted only during the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., and can be conducted for up to three consecutive days.
- Only items of personal property, which are owned by the residents of the premises, shall be sold or offered for sale.
- Notice on parkway of the sale shall not be posted more than 24 hours prior to the intended commencement hour of such sale, and such notice shall be removed not more than four hours after the conclusion of such sale. NO banners or flags are allowed for posting a garage sale.
- The resident extends an invitation to any Village inspector or officer to enter upon that portion of the premises whereon such a sale is being or is about to be conducted, for the purpose of inspection or compliance with these regulations, and such inspector or officer may order the sale closed.



## U.S. Senator Richard Durbin Visits Hillside to Express Support for Programs That Enable Hillside's Fire Department to Be Rated Among the Best in the Country

On March 31st, United States Senator Richard Durbin held a press conference for the Chicago media in front of the Hillside Village Hall to proclaim his full support for the Fire and Safety Act, which would reauthorize the Assistance to Firefighters Grants (AFG) Program and the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Program. A vote on this legislation is to occur during this session in Congress because these programs are set to expire after September 30, 2023.

Senator Durbin stated, "Every day, firefighters put their lives on the line to protect our communities and help save lives, Congress has a responsibility to pass the Fire Grants and Safety Act to make sure fire departments have access to the funding they need for training, personnel, and equipment."

Hillside Fire Chief Kenneth Carling commented. "These Programs have given the Hillside Fire Department the ability to purchase the highest quality of modern fire equipment, and to maintain adequate staffing levels to meet the needs of our community. Senator Dick Durbin has been a tremendous resource and advocate for the Village of Hillside in helping to secure these additional funds."

Since 2005, the Village of Hillside Fire Department has been awarded \$5,171,786 in Federal funding. These grants are instrumental in ensuring that the Hillside Fire Department has the resources needed to respond to emergencies efficiently and effectively while helping to maintain the safety of our firefighters.

"With the support of Senator Durbin, Mayor Tamburino, and the Village Board of Trustees, the Hillside Fire Department will continue to seek out alternative funding methods in order to alleviate some of the financial burden on our taxpayers. This will allow us to support our firefighters, and strengthen public safety within our community, along with fulfilling the mission, vision, and values of the Hillside Fire Department," Chief Carling concluded.

## Hillside's Emergency Management Wants You to Be Prepared for Unforeseen Disasters

It is that time of year when a sudden storm or even a tornado unexpectedly pops up. Hillside's Emergency Management Team believes every household should have a plan in place in the event of an emergency.

First of all, know how to shut off electricity, gas, and water. Does everyone know where to go if sirens go off or alerts go to cell phones? Do you know the difference between a watch, warning, and emergency? Make sure at least one person in your family is monitoring the forecast. Enact weather alerts on your phone through your local emergency management agency or a news outlet. Consider doing the following:

#### **Basic Disaster Supplies Kit**

To assemble your kit, store items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers such as plastic bins or a duffel bag. A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- Water (one gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation)
- Food (at least a several-day supply of non-perishable food)
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
- Flashlight
- First aid kit
- Extra batteries
- Whistle (to signal for help)
- Dust mask (to help filter contaminated air)
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter in place)
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)
- Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities)
- Manual can opener (for food)
- Local maps
- Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery

#### **Additional Emergency Supplies**

Consider adding the following items:

- Prescription eyeglasses and contact lens solution
- Infant formula, bottles, diapers, wipes, and diaper rash cream
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Cash or traveler's checks
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records saved electronically or in a waterproof, portable container
- Masks (for everyone ages 2 and above), soap, hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes to disinfect surfaces
- Prescription medications. About half of all Americans take prescription medicine every day. An emergency can make it
  difficult for them to refill their prescription or to find an open pharmacy. Organize and protect your prescriptions,
  over-the-counter drugs, and vitamins to prepare for an emergency.
- Non-prescription medications such as pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medication, antacids, or laxatives
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
- Complete change of clothing appropriate for your climate and sturdy shoes
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

#### **Maintaining Your Kit**

After assembling your kit, remember to maintain it so it's ready when needed:

- Keep canned food in a cool, dry place.
- Store boxed food in tightly closed plastic or metal containers.
- Replace expired items as needed.

## Memorial Day Honoring the 1,304,702 Who Made the Ultimate Sacrifice for Our Freedom



Originally called Decoration Day stemming from the early tradition of decorating graves with flowers, wreaths and flags, Memorial Day is a day for remembrance of those who have died in service to our country. By proclamation of General John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of former union sailors and soldiers, it was first widely observed on May 30, 1868 to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers.

During that first national commemoration, former Union General and sitting Ohio Congressman James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, after which 5,000 participants helped to decorate

the graves of the more than 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers who were buried there. The Civil War resulted in the greatest number of casualties with over 600,000 deaths, which is more than World Wars I and II, and Vietnam combined

This national event galvanized efforts to honor and remember fallen soldiers that began with local observances at burial grounds in several towns throughout the United States following the end of the Civil War, such as the May 1, 1865 gathering in Charleston, South Carolina organized by freed slaves to pay tribute and give proper burial to Union troops.

In 1873, New York was the first state to designate Memorial Day as a legal holiday. By the late 1800s, many more cities and communities observed Memorial Day, and several states had declared it a legal holiday.

After World War I, it became an occasion for honoring those who died in all of America's wars and was then more widely established as a national holiday throughout the United States.

In 1971, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act and established that Memorial Day was to be commemorated on the last Monday of May.

On Memorial Day, cemeteries across America are decorated with flags that tell the world, "Here Lies a Veteran"! No suburban town honors present day veterans and those who bravely fought for our ideals and never returned home like the Village of Hillside does.

#### Final Thoughts from Mayor Joseph T. Tamburino

Dear Neighbors,

One of my favorite quotes about summer is "I wonder what it would be like to live in a world where it was always June."—L. M. Montgomery (Canadian author of books like Anne of Green Gables). Let's be honest, after months of frigid weather, summer is our favorite season because the days are longer, and the world just seems brighter and more carefree. However, for the moment, my thoughts of summer must be put to the side as I inform you of news and events occurring in Hillside.

I am elated to report that our Hillside Fire Department was evaluated by the national *Insurance* Services Office (ISO) and the Public Protection Classification - Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS) and earned a Class 1 grade rating for its fire protection services. ISO's analysis considers suppression capabilities (staffing, equipment, and station location), fire prevention code and code enforcement, training, emergency communications, building codes, and the quality of the water distribution system. This rating results in lower insurance costs for businesses and homes in that department's jurisdiction. Out of 39,850 fire departments nationwide only 388 departments achieved this #1 rating. Great job to all those who played a part in helping receive this outstanding rating.

While on the subject of First Responders, Hillside Police Chief Murphy has completed a reorganization of the Department, which has shifted administrative police personnel back to patrolling the streets. Without hiring additional officers, Hillside now has more officers performing patrol duties than we have had in several years.

As you read on pages 2 and 3 in this issue, our Summer Nights in Hillside Concert Series has expanded to two musical acts performing at each of the six concerts. Our Tuesday concerts have been a huge hit drawing thousands to the Hillside Commons. I noticed that the crowds would start gathering at 5 p.m. and would just sit around until the concerts began at 7:30. I decided why not hire local musical talent and give them exposure while supplying entertainment to the waiting throng of concert goers. I believe this will only add to the good vibe these concerts have brought to Hillside as reported by two Chicago area TV stations.

The Village Board has approved the hiring of *Jensen and Halstead LTD* for architectural and engineering design work associated with the renovation of the Village Hall. This firm will supply the blueprint for moving the library from its present location, a new community room, a gym for our youth, and improved training facilities for our police and fire departments. This construction will be funded by a state grant.

Lastly, school is still in session but that has not stopped Hillside's Community Relations Commission from selecting Saturday, August 12 for the Village of Hillside Back to School Celebration! It will be held in the Village Hall Boardroom from noon to 2 p.m. The event includes a free lunch, music, door prizes, giveaway items, and much more. There will be more information in the next edition of the Hillside Herald.
